Wrapping Up Building Growing Serving 3-Year Capital Campaign (April 2008-March 2011) by Dr. Ryan Wilson

As the U.S. economy has taken a beating, what an interesting time it has been for us at Trinity to focus on stewardship through our 3-year campaign! I think that God's timing for Trinity may be very telling on some things that God hopes our congregation will learn for years to come.

A couple of weeks ago, Kay and I completed our three-year commitment to Building, Growing Serving. This is the first time in our lives that we have financially participated in a building effort at a church. Over the three years, we have definitely reassessed our lifestyle, reordered some priorities and reallocated some of our resources. I know many of you have as well.

As I reflect about the whole process, I find myself excited about our church and what God is doing. I am humbled to be a part of this congregation and challenged to continue to grow in my stewardship practices. Through the process, there is no question that my faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of my life has been renewed. I feel even more committed to our theme of Building disciples of Jesus Christ, Growing in our faith, and Serving others in Christ's name. I have watched over the last three years and have seen God do some amazing things in the lives of folks at Trinity and in our community. People's lives are being transformed toward God!

I truly believe that our campaign will continue to help strengthen and expand Trinity's unique faith heritage in our community and beyond. As we complete the 3-year campaign, I hope your faith in Christ is strengthened and that your stewardship practices to God's kingdom are enhanced. I will look forward to hearing some things that you have learned through this three-year process and hope that we can encourage one another as we share our stories.

With every ending, there is a new beginning. Trehel anticipates being done with construction and renovation by the end of this year. As we move forward with construction, we have known that the total cost of the project was more than we originally pledged. Therefore, the deacons have asked our Building, Growing Serving Executive Committee to help us with a 2-year extension. The hope is that through our 2-year extension, we will pay off any money borrowed as quickly as possible. We have also added \$10,000 to our 2011 budget to go toward our building fund. The more we give over and above our budget through this 2-year extension, the less we will have to put into our 2012 and 2013 budgets. You will be receiving a brochure about the 2-year campaign in the middle of March and a pledge card toward the end of March. We will all be asked to turn in our pledges on Sunday, April 10th and celebrate what God is doing in the life of Trinity!

Spring is almost here and our Sanctuary choir has already started rehearsing for our Easter cantata. On Easter Sunday we will present "Come Walk with Me" by Pepper Choplin during our morning worship. This music carries us through all the ways that lead to the cross, the resurrection, and then sends us out to witness God's love through our lives and sharing with others. We rehearse each Wednesday night at 7:15pm and will welcome others to sing with us if you can. We also will be singing for the Lenten service at our church on March 23 at noon. Choir members are urged to be here by 11:40am to robe and rehearse.

Our children are working on their musical for this spring. You will be hearing more about this and their presentation dates. Our youth choir will be singing for us in worship each month and are preparing for their summer choir tour. Trinity Ringers will ring in our service on March 20.

These opportunities for you to use your talents for worship and sharing God's message are for all ages who will come. Come and serve with us through music. Keep a song in your heart! Jo
